

Plan For Golf Course at I.S.C. Is Progressing

The realization of a hope for an 18-hole golf course on the Iowa State college campus is now contingent entirely upon land adjustments to be made within the college itself. It was announced Thursday by Dr. R. M. Hughes, president.

Tentative plans, which have been drawn up for such a course include an abandoned orchard site and a wooded area to the north of the college athletic field. These plans include a pasture area now used by the animal husbandry department.

If additional land can be obtained by the college for pasture purposes, final plans for the golf course will be drawn up, Dr. Hughes said. The college is attempting to purchase more land for the animal husbandry department at the present time.

Tentative plans for the course already have been formulated by Perry Maxwell, a golf expert from Tulsa, Okla., who has gone over the proposed area with college athletic officials. The present plans call for establishment of the first hole of the course less than a quarter of a mile from State gym.

The course would then go under a North Western railroad viaduct to the north for 16 holes of play and circle back to the approximate starting place for the eighteenth cup.

College officials hope to have the course entirely developed within two years.
