

Ardmore Engineers Favor New Highway

ARDMORE, Nov. 10.—(Special.)—Engineers of Ardmore and Davis endorsed the proposed Hockaday trail following their inspection this week, and proposed that immediate steps be taken in promoting the project.

A second expedition was made to Turner Falls to reach some conclusion as to the best method of constructing a permanent road from Ardmore, past the falls to Davis.

G. A. Ramsey, chairman of the chamber of commerce good roads committee, accompanied by Perry D. Maxwell, president of the chamber of commerce; Frank Gates, director chamber of commerce; Marion Pierce and Roy Johnson, county commissioners; D. G. McCulley, county engineer, and several other Ardmore citizens made up the party which inspected the road.

At Turner Falls the Ardmore party was met by a group of Davis citizens, accompanied by the Murray county engineer. The engineers of the two counties will meet again in a few days.

The road will shorten the distance between Ardmore and Oklahoma City by about eighteen miles.
