topography of the Hillcrest course site is fine. It will make one of the best eighteen-hole golf courses in the state."

Mr. Maxwell has had much experience in building golf courses. He built one of the Tulsa courses, the Ardmore course, the course at Muskogee and the famous Twin Hills course at Oklahoma City. The question of sand or grass greens came up at the meeting last night and the committee decided in favor of sand greens.

"In this section" said Mr. Maxwell, in discussing the question of the character of the greens, "you are just north of 36° or in that region where you are too far south for blue grass and too far north for a good stand of Bermuda. The Bermuda greens at Tulsa, Muskogee, and Oklahoma City were killed out last winter by that heavy sleet. Those at Ardmore came through all right. I am of the opinion that you would make a mistake here in trying anything except sand."

Mr. Maxwell said he would come to Bartlesville at once and stake off the new course and begin the actual work of constructing fairways and greens. The course may be ready for play late this summer.
