

HILLCRESTERS OPEN GREENS ON SUNDAY

UNUSUALLY FINE AMATEUR-
PRO FOURSOME TO DO
FIRST OFFICIAL ROUND.

Strasburger-Norton of Local Club
to Meet Broadus-Gullane Com-
bination From Bartlesville;
Tee Off at 1:30.

A large gallery of members and invited guests is expected to follow the first formal foursome over the new Hillcrest Country club golf course Sunday afternoon, when a special quartet of club-swingers is scheduled to open officially the club's new grass tees and greens.

Harry Strasburger, Jr., the local club's No. 1 amateur, Broadmoor champion and always a threat in the state championship races, is to be paired with Al Norton, pro at Hillcrest, against V. T. Broadus, No. 1 amateur from Bartlesville Hillcrest and former Oklahoma amateur champ, and James Gullane, Bartlesville Hillcrest professional, Oklahoma state pro champ. The 18-hole foursome, probably one of the best ever staged in this section of the country, will tee off at 1:30 o'clock, following a brief ceremony at the clubhouse.

The program opening the new grass greens course, the first ever built here, really opens with ladies' day activities tomorrow morning, members of the club being privileged to use the course thereafter. The program tomorrow will consist chiefly of a blind bogey for the women of the club. All play on the new course is to be strictly according to U. S. G. A. rules, it is announced.

A still bigger opening program, after the grass greens are expected to be in their best possible condition, is planned for some time in the fall, with a program headed by internationally known golfers to be open to the general public.
