

# FOR NEW GOLF COURSE

## Work Starts on New 18-Hole Course at Country Club

Work started today on a new 18-hole golf course for the Lawrence Country Club. Axes were purchased and men went into the 48 acres of new ground to clear it of brush and small trees. Next will follow seeding of the ground, then a complete change in fairways and grass greens.

The additional ground, north of the present course, was purchased last year making a total of 128.5 acres in the entire tract. Recently arrangements were made for the sale of additional stock to both new and old members to finance the expansion program.

Otto Barteldes, president, said today the project would be completed by April 1, 1936. At that time members will have a completely new course with all holes rearranged. Many hill climbs will be eliminated making it much less tiresome to play.

The new course was designed by J. T. Riggs-Miller who is an expert at such work. Actual construction will be under the direction of Perry Maxwell, Ardmore, Oklahoma, who has redesigned many courses in eastern states in recent years.

Members of a special committee in charge of the new course are: Al Bromelsick chairman, Irving Hill, Wm. Essick, Glenn Charlton, Elmer Lupton and Harry Nevin.
