FARMER'S FORUM.

John Mulkey if Mulkey, who owns pretty close to 1,000 acres of Washita bottom lands aspires to be the biggest grower of Bermuda in the country. He planted some of the roots last year and they did well. He placed them every three feet and says the rains which came in June put the plants to growing and they covered the surface of the land and made good summer and fall pasture. He is planning more this year and when the spring planting is finished he will have 62 acres devoted to Bermuda grass. Next spring he plans to finish out the farm of 100 acres. Perry Maxwell who has tried Bermuda and who coined the expression that 'Bermuda is to Oklahoma what blue grass is to Kentucky,' is still of that opinion and Mr. Mulkey's crop will give the grass a thorough test.
