

## Oil Millionaires Spend \$650,000 On Deluxe Country Club In Tulsa

TULSA, Okla., Feb. 28 — (AP)— The Southern Hills country club, a \$650,000 "recreation area" where Tulsa's oil millionaires and their families will play golf and many other sports, will be ready for use in the spring.

The club, which will have a \$125,000 clubhouse, an 18-hole championship golf course, two polo fields, stables, trap shooting range, tennis courts, swimming pool and stocked fish pond, has been described as the most costly and complete plant of its kind built in the country since the depression.

The golf course is the pride of the members of the swank new club.

### 'Bunkers For Beauty'

The course, designed by Perry Maxwell, Ardmore, Okla., golf architect, is the "finest I've ever done," says the designer.

"It is a test of golfing skill for any man regardless of his game," said Maxwell.

The site is a heavily wooded, 300-acre tract dotted with knolls and cut by ravines.

"It is such a natural lie for a course that there is little need for bunkers and many of them have been put in just as a touch to add to the beauty," said Maxwell.

The course has everything that money could buy put into it.

The trees, for example, are not trees, they are "teeing areas". Some of them 60 yards long and 40 or more feet wide. Playing from the front of the teeing areas, the course is 6,850 yards.

"This really gives us more than one golf course," explained Don Bothwell, director, who had a hand in designing the course. "We will have three sets of markers on each
