

Construction Work on Hillcrest is Started

A force of men under direction of one of Perry Maxwell's expert golf course constructors went to work Tuesday at Hillcrest.

Mr. Maxwell is the course architect for the club and is to construct an eighteen hole, sand greens course. This will cost the sports of Bartlesville anywhere from twenty to thirty thousand dollars. It's a harbinger of better times, but not a sure sign of spring. The course architect means to get the ground cleared, his fairways staked, and have his general grounds and greens plan well in hand before a touch of winter may halt the work.

Before the end of the week the Hillcrest building committee expects to have from E. B. Delk, clubhouse architect, his detail plan for the interior of the \$70,000 playhouse. The ground plan of the club as proposed by Mr. Delk did not register with the committee because these men kept in mind a greater number to be entertained than the present closed membership might suggest. The outside plan has been practically agreed between the committee and the architect. As soon as the latter gets a ground plan that suits the committee he will be able to go to work on the final plan for the clubhouse.

The committee expects to have this building ready for use this summer.
