

COUNTRY CLUB IS NAMED OAK HILLS

New Moniker For Outing Quarters for Ada Club Members.

It's Oak Hill County Club, if you please. The massy records of the office of the Secretary of State in the Capitol building at Oklahoma City reveal a previous organization chartered in Ada under the moniker of the Ada Country Club which necessitated the selection of a new name for the Country Club organization now forming here.

The previous organization was composed of a group of Ada sportsmen who at one time held a lease on the city lake for hunting and fishing purposes. The organization has been inactive for a number of years.

Preliminary work on the grounds and golf course at Oak Hills, which will be located just east of the residence of P. A. Norris, and upon land which Mr. Norris leased to the new organization for 50 years, is progressing rapidly. The survey of the land has been completed and the tract will comprise 70.40 acres, most of which will be used for the golf course. A tract of eight and one-half acres adjoining the golf course property on the northeast has been acquired by purchase for the purpose of securing a roadway which will join the Ada-Allen Highway at a point opposite the old Francis road. The club house and other permanent improvements will also be erected on this site.

As soon as weather conditions will permit, a gravel road will be built connecting the highway and the site for the clubhouse, a distance of some 800 feet, and the actual construction of the clubhouse will begin. Work on the golf course will continue, and according to Perry Maxwell of Ardmore, Golf Course Architect in charge of the construction, devotees of the Ancient and Honorable may tee off for a round by the first of April.

Considerable progress has been made in the past week by those in charge of organization. Over twenty new members have been added to the list and by the time of the completion of the project, it is thought by those in charge that the entire quota originally planned by the organization will be filled.

The plans for the clubhouse, while yet in formation, will include a room large enough for all social gatherings with connecting dining-room, butler's pantry and kitchen on the first floor. The basement will contain locker rooms and shower baths, repair shop and concession room. Present plans call for a 12-foot porch on the east, south and west sides of the clubhouse. Electric lights, gas and water will be secured by connecting with the city systems.
