

# RED CROSS ROLL CALL CAMPAIGN FOR CARTER COUNTY MAPPED OUT

A meeting was held Tuesday evening in the directors' room of the First National Bank to plan the forthcoming roll call campaign of the Red Cross, which will open Nov. 2. Those in attendance were George W. Coffman, Mrs. B. A. Simpson, Mrs. C. L. Anderson, John F. Easley, Mrs. W. F. Dabber, Mrs. C. G. Squires, Mrs. H. H. Sayre, Mrs. Minnie B. Church, Mrs. W. C. Baker, Mark Kirkpatrick, Frank S. Gates and Perry Maxwell.

Mr. Maxwell is chairman for Carter county in the roll call, which will be made for the purpose of getting as many members of the Red Cross as possible. The membership fee is one dollar a year, and that is all any individual is expected to contribute to the roll call solicitors.

Present at the meeting was Mrs. William H. Prehn of St. Louis, division representative of the southwestern division of the American Red Cross. Mrs. Prehn stated that the Junior Red Cross roll call will be a feature of the coming campaign, and that the money contributed by the Junior section will be used as follows: Sixty per cent for the relief of European children and 40 per cent kept in this country for the benefit of crippled children whose parents are unable to provide treatment for them.

It was stated also that the Red Cross fed nearly 2,000 persons the morning after the recent disastrous storm at Corpus Christi, the workers being there even in advance of the storm. They foresaw what was coming and prepared for it.

"It is the primary purpose of the American Red Cross to be of service to Americans," is one of the statements in Red Cross literature.
