

Work to Start On S. Mountain Golf Club Links

Work on the golf course on South Mountain, Fayetteville's new country club, will be resumed next week, following employment of Perry D. Maxwell, of Ardmore, Oklahoma, as general overseer of the work in place of J. F. Francis, resigned. Mr. Maxwell, who built the new Hardscrabble country club course at Fort Smith, will arrive early next week with an assistant, and expects to have the first nine holes of the course playable by July or August.

Only a verbal agreement was made with Mr. Maxwell when he visited here Sunday, but a definite contract probably will be signed as soon as he returns.

An inspection of the country club site was made, when Mr. Maxwell was accompanied by some half-dozen club members, who make up a committee of arrangement. The visitor was enthusiastic, and told the committee that one of the loveliest courses in this section could be built on the location. "With the possibil-
