

One of the most unique events ever attempted in the golf industry will take place in Kansas City, Mo., February 7 at the National Turf Conference and Equipment Show sponsored by the Greenkeeping Superintendents Association.

This feature, a model green-building contest, will be participated in by delegates from some 30 odd states. Topographic maps have already been distributed so that each group can prepare preliminary plans. This map indicates the direction of play, specifies prevailing winds, and allows a space of 125 yards by 500 yards. The actual model to be built in Kansas City must be designed within a space of 10 feet square.

The judges will determine the winner on a basis of 20 per cent for each of the following requirements: General appearance, contour of green and traps with relation to economical maintenance, most interesting, design most suitable for average golfer, and the best basic construction.

Cash prizes will be awarded by the Greenkeeping Superintendents Association to the committee that wins.

Perry Maxwell, golf architect, has been invited to act as one of the judges in this contest where the nations best greenkeeping minds will be pitted against each other.
