Work on the club house, to cost \$150,000, will be started within a month, Harry A. Cambell, club secretary, said. The golf course, for which \$100,000 has been set aside, already is under construction. The course laid out by Perry Maxwell, widely known golf course dodigaer, will have sodded Bermuda fairways and some of them were given first soaking by the elaborate watering system last week. The swimming pool, built in a teshape, has a straightaway of \$2 feet, six inches, meeting the Olympic swimming race requirements with space for seven lanes.
