

Iowa State Opens New Golf Course

150-Acre Recreation Area to
Cost \$80,000 Complete.

Ames, Ia. —(AP)— Iowa State college formally opened and dedicated its 150-acre recreation area and golf course Thursday afternoon in connection with ceremonies of veishea, all-college exposition.

Dean M. D. Helsler of the junior college, in the absence of President Charles E. Friley, presented the course to the college.

Keller Attends.

A hand picked Iowa State golf foresome teed off for first round play and was followed by seven additional foresomes, consisting of leading pro and amateur golfers in the state.

State Administrator George Keller of the Works Progress administration and Perry Maxwell, Oklahoma landscape architect, were present at the dedication ceremonies.

Finest in Midwest.

College officials described the course as the finest in the midwest and estimated it would cost about \$80,000 when completed. The area also has cross country tracks, a picnic grounds and bridle paths.

Athletic department officials said it is the only 18-hole college golf course directly adjacent to the educational plant and other playfields.

Work on the area was spread over nearly three years.
