

# CARTER COUNTY CHAPTER RED CROSS ELECTS OFFICERS FOR ENSUING YEAR

Mark Winklerich was elected chairman of Carter County Red Cross Chapter at a recent meeting of the executive board, called by Mrs. William Frock, division representative of the Southern Division, St. Louis, for the purpose of electing officers for the ensuing year, and to outline the Peacetime program of the national organization of the American Red Cross.

Representatives from each branch in the county are to be appointed later.

Mrs. Squares will also be secretary of home service work, which deals primarily with soldiers, sailors and their families. She has had charge of this work sometime. She will attend the Home Service Institute, early in the year, conducted at the state university, at Norman.

The former Red Cross headquarters at Convention Hall will again be opened and open more Red Cross work to Ardmore and Carter county will resume activity, carrying out the big program of public health and social service, which is being carried out so successfully by county organizations throughout the United States.

Of special interest is the announcement that an instructor from St. Louis headquarters will be assigned to Carter county and classes in home hygiene and care of the sick, will begin sometime during January, under her personal direction.

Classes will be organized in Ardmore by Mrs. Baker, while Mrs. Church will organize classes in the county. Each course will comprise 16 lessons.

The value of these lessons and the advantages to be gained cannot be overestimated, and there is no doubt but that the opportunity thus afford-

ed will be taken advantage of with the heartiest co-operation.

Classes in First Aid will be organized by Mrs. Wellerstone and instruction will be given by a competent physician to be appointed later.

The junior Red Cross program, under the direction of Mrs. Newcomer and Mr. Coffman will also resume its activities of patriotic training.
