

Fort Worth Club Gets National Golf Open

NEW YORK, May 2 (AP) — Golf's biggest tournament, the National Open, has been awarded to the Colonial Golf Club of Fort Worth for 1941, United States Golf Association officials announced last night.

The selection came several days after a committee had met to formally receive invitations.

The Colonial Club, comparatively new and one of the few championship courses in the Southwest with bent grass greens, had been angling for the tournament for more than a year. Marvin Leonard, owner, had hoped to land the meet for 1940.

Reliable sources said the Colonial Club had been tendered the National P.G.A. meet for 1940 but held off because a previous bid for the National Open had been entered.
