While there was no state tennis organ. fullon until the following year, the first tale championship tournament was held al Oklahoma City in 1908. There were tenty-two entries in singles and twelve leams in doubles, John T. Balley of Albion, Okla. was the first title winner. tating Charles T. Spelce of Kingfisher in the finals, 6-4, 6-2, 6-0. Speice, patrod Eth Earl Mick, that famous Kingfisher college team, won the doubles finals from R. E. Conger and R. A. Vose of bilahoma City. The Oklahoma City team son the first set after a hard battle, lit the collegians came back and won the next three sets, all of which were billy contested. The scores were 6-8, 1.2, 5-1, 6-2.

in 1969 a state association was organited and because afflitated with the United States National Lawn Tennis speciation, John T. Builey was elected nesident, Charles Speice, vice president; F.
