

# MAXWELL VISITS ENID GOLF CLUB TO SUGGEST CHANGES FOR AN EIGHTEEN HOLE COURSE

The following article, describing a visit of Perry Maxwell to Enid for the purpose of describing the changes necessary to the golf course of the Enid Country Club from nine to eighteen holes, is from the Enid Daily Eagle.

Mr. Maxwell has made a thorough study of golf course architecture over a period of years, and is personally acquainted with and has consulted every professional architect of prominence in the United States.

"The Enid Country Club has been honored by the visit Sunday of Mr. Perry Maxwell, of Ardmore, who met with a very enthusiastic reception from the officials and members of the club as he explained the work necessary to change the present course from a nine-hole to an eighteen-hole course, which will make the Enid club one of the finest in the country. Mr. Maxwell is vice-president of the First National Bank at Ardmore, but this is only secondary to him, as he is first a golf enthusiast of the first order, not as a player, but as a designer of the golf courses. He has made a very thorough study of this and has traveled throughout the United States visiting at least one hundred of the best clubs in the country.

He laid out the Ardmore Country club nine years ago with grass greens, and experts pronounce it one of the best and most artistic courses in the southwest.

Mr. Maxwell has laid out several other courses in Oklahoma and he is very enthusiastic over the prospect of the additional nine holes the Enid Country Club will start on immediately under his planning. These will lie to the north of the present course, running through the rough ground and woods in that vicinity and will be laid out with the idea of beauty and sportiness combined.

It is the intention of the club to change the present sand greens to grass in the near future.
