

Perry Maxwell Sells Golf Course For Immense Sum

Perry Maxwell, well known Ardmore citizen, has just completed a big deal in Oklahoma City, whereby the Twin Hills golf course, owned by him, becomes the property of Keefe Carter, youthful son of Dorset Carter, oil and railway magnate.

Keefe Carter won the state championship in Ardmore at Dornick Hills in 1924, and has been a recognized factor in the golf world since that time. At present he is wearing the Western Amateur crown.

There is something of a history connected with Twin Hills course. Perry Maxwell, after severing his connection with a local bank here, decided that he would become an architect of golf courses.

The most popular links in Oklahoma and Missouri have been layed out by Mr. Maxwell who, without a doubt, is the greatest golf architect in this country.

When he acquired ownership of Twin Hills he decided he had about reached his goal and was getting on very nicely when the recent tempting offer was made.

Nears \$100,000 Mark

The cash consideration was not definitely given by either the seller or purchaser but it is said to be close to six figures.

Carter plans to build a club house on the course and open it as a commercial proposition. Golf is growing in popularity every day and is no longer considered an old man's game, as attested by the thousands of youthful players showing their stuff at every important tournament in the world.

Twin Hills is said to be one of the five great golf courses in the United States and has received high praise from world renowned golfers who have been over it.
