

HARRINGTON TO OPEN WINSTON PARK TODAY

New WPA Recreation Center
Costing \$450,000 to Be
Dedicated.

WINSTON-SALEM, May 31.—
(AP)—The new Reynolds park,
covering 188 acres and including
all types of modern recreational fa-
cilities, will be publicly presented
tomorrow with exercises featuring
an all-day program of social and
athletic events.

Highlighting the day will be the
appearance of Col. F. C. Harrington,
federal WPA administrator, who
will make the formal presentation,
with Major James R. Fain making
the acceptance on behalf of the city.

The park, plans for which were
approved by the board of city al-
dermen in October, 1938, was ac-
tually started the last day of Janu-
ary, 1939, when George W. Cain,
former mayor of Winston-Salem
and then state WPA administrator,
turned the first shovel of dirt.
Mayor Fain at that time was chair-
man of the park committee of the
chamber of commerce and partici-
pated in the ground-breaking.

The new park, with an elaborate
18-hole golf course, gymnasium,
tennis courts, swimming pool and
grill, represents an expenditure of
approximately \$450,000.
