

# Yost Sponsors Golf Course At Michigan

**C**HICAGO — One of the finest golf courses in mid-America will be thrown open on Sept. 18 when Fielding H. Yost dedicates the fairways and greens he has built for the pleasure of the students and faculty of the University of Michigan.

Yost is exhibiting the same enthusiasm in the development of his golf course he showed during his long years as the magician behind the Wolverine football teams. The "old man" has been on a speaking tour and when interviewed said, among other things: "I can hardly wait to get home and get busy on the landscaping of our golf course."

Michigan's golf course is built on the gentle slopes that surround Ann Arbor and is the product of the architectural skill of Dr. Mackenzie,

who designed several of the best courses on the Pacific coast and who now is laying out the one L. W. St. John is constructing for Ohio State university.

Michigan's course will measure 6,200 yards under ordinary conditions but for championship play can be stretched to 6,650.

The greens which are extraordinarily large, averaging 8,500 square feet in expanse, are so designed that six of the holes can be made one stroke harder by placing the cups on the back slopes of the carpets.

Yost contemplates adding nine additional holes to the lay out within the next few years as he will be able to purchase a course already in use, that adjoins the university property.

Eventually a club house of modest proportions will be built on the course but for the present the two field houses will serve as dressing rooms for the players. The course adjoins Ferry field, the seat of Michigan's great athletic plant, and there are more than 8,000 lockers available in the field houses.

Michigan will provide its students with the cheapest golf in the world. Director Yost plans charging only \$15 per year and divide that into the fall and spring seasons. If possible he will even reduce that fee, once the course is in use. The course cost the university \$300,000 of which only \$75,000 went into construction, the remainder was expended in the purchase of the land.

It is Yost's plan to invite all "M" men for the dedication of the course and have their niblicks inaugurate the use of the fairways and greens rather than have some celebrated stars to drop the first putts.

"Intercollegiate football built the golf course," said the veteran director, "and also supplied the sinews for the two and one half millions we have expended upon the development of our athletic plant during the past nine years. And I think that today intercollegiate athletics are in healthiest condition they ever have been and have nothing to fear of the future."
