

50 New Members For So. Mt. Club Dues to Be Raised

Fifty additional members, making a total of 200, are to be taken into the South Mountain Development company, Fayetteville's new country club, it was decided at a meeting of the board Wednesday night. An entrance fee of \$300 instead of \$200 is to be charged these new members, it was announced.

"With considerably increased valuation of the 182 acres the company includes, we feel that this increased fee is very reasonable," Morgan McMichael, member of the board, said in expressing the opinion of the group. "The original 150 members ought to consider themselves lucky for getting in on the first group."

The company will be made a legal body by the circuit judge in the next term of court here. Election of a new board from among the 150 members will be held at that time. A plan of financing so that immediate work will be started on the stone clubhouse will be presented at that meeting by the finance committee, appointed at Wednesday's meeting, who in the meantime will have perfected a plan. This committee is composed of Dr. N. F. Drake, chairman, George Appleby, Hayden McLroy, L. H. Kempton and Morgan McMichael.

A temporary greens committee, composed of Roy Wood, Dr. Allan A. Gilbert, Mr. Kempton and Mr. Appleby, was appointed. They are to superintend the work, now nearing completion of Perry D. Maxwell, architect, and are to be responsible to the club members for this work.

All rough work on the course has been completed. Springing of Bermuda grass on greens and fairways will be underway within a few days, Mr. McMichael said, as soon as weather will permit. Mr. Maxwell returned Thursday morning from Philadelphia, where he has been in charge of construction of a course, and expressed great pleasure at the rapid progress of work here.
