

# EMPTY BEING MADE TO RAISE SCHOOL MONEY

## Ardmore Presbytery of Church Planning to Secure Quota of Fund for Univer- sity of Tulsa.

The Ardmore Presbytery, which includes many of the larger cities of northern Oklahoma, is this week attempting to raise \$50,000 as its part of a \$1,000,000 fund for the Tulsa University at Tulsa.

Ardmore, Pauls Valley, Purcell, Ada, Sulphur, Tishomingo, Madill and Marietta are among the cities in this presbytery where the work has been organized. Perry Maxwell is chairman of the local committee which is composed of George R. Fish, H. H. Johnson, Roy Johnson and C. E. Sykes.

While no figures are available it is understood that a good portion of the amount had been raised.

No specific quotas have been allotted to the cities or presbyteries, Rev D. D. Binney, associate pastor of the First Presbyterian church, said today, but the Ardmore district set \$50,000 as their goal.

Tulsa has undertaken to raise \$700,000 of the amount and has called upon the state to raise the remaining \$300,000. Subscriptions are payable semi-annually over a period of three years, according to the campaign plans.

Tulsa University which formerly was known as Henry Kendall College, is 100 years old. It started as an Indian mission school for girls under supervision of the Woman's Board of Home Missions of the Presbyterian church. It was turned over to the Presbyterian Synod of Oklahoma, which is responsible for its care.
