BROOK HOLLOW COUNTRY CLUB NO. 11 HOLE, 445 YARDS, PAR 4.

If it's length you want, this hole has it. Yes, 445 yards of tough sledding. With a feeling on the tee that you are miles from the green, the natural tendency is to hit the ball with a Babe Ruth swing and it ends, unlike his homers, a pop fly into the thickly wooded section at the left or, more generally, into the sand trap or rough at the right. Barring this bad luck we can hit our drive down the fairway and challenge the next shot to a No. 1 iron or spoon at 200 yards.

Fort Worth golfers led the Dallas crew a merry chase over the Glen Garden course in Thursday's qualifying rounds for the annual Glen Garden invitation meet. With 16-year-old Buster Adams and surprising Jimmy Walkup setting the pace with 70's and Iverson Martin taking the show money with his 72, Dallas golfers were warned as early as possible that they would have no easy job of winning the meet.
