

# EVANS PLAYS A SPLENDID GAME

## Local Youth and Carter in Spectacular Play at Junior Championship Golf Meet

The most spectacular game and easily the feature match of Tuesday's rounds of match play in the Oklahoma State junior golf championship at Lakeside was performed by Will D. Evans, 16 year old youth of Ardmore and Keefe Carter of Oklahoma City, according to reports from the meet. Although Evans, rated by golfers throughout the entire state as one of the strongest juniors in the state was defeated by Carter by a margin of 3 and 3 in the second round of play. Evans smothered Chester Armstrong 3 and 6 in the first round.

Carter is well known among junior golfers of the state. He is 19 years old and is slated to win state honor before the meet has closed. He won the Junior gold medal in the tournament at Tulsa recently.

Will Evans is the son of Reese Evans of this city and is well known in Ardmore not only for his golf prowess, but by his school mates. He is a senior next year in the high school. Reese Evans is an official in local golf circles and most of young Evans training was secured at the Dornick Hills course.

At a meeting Tuesday night of stockholders of the Dornick Hills country club three committees were appointed to make tentative arrangements for the construction of a new 18-hole course. Perry Maxwell has charge of the committee work.

It is the plan of local golfers to secure the next State Golf Tournament for Ardmore next year. More than 600 golfers attended the recent tournament at Tulsa and fully that number are expected to visit this city if the 1924 tournament is staged here.
