

Heretofore a wide open green, No. 9 at Dornick Hills is being revamped to penalize the wild swingers who come slicing up the fairway. Under direction of Dean Woods, foreman of construction for Perry Maxwell, nationally-known golf architect, a sand trap is being installed on the west side. Greenskeeper Jack Hignight and a crew of men have been digging diligently when the weather permitted.

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Another suggestion from Woods that will be carried out is the filling in and sodding of traps back of the famous cliff hole, No. 7. Sand is an unfair hazard, Woods said, when it cannot be seen by the approaching golfer. Number 7 green, small and perched high on a rocky ledge, is easily missed. Once over and the unfortunate player finds himself among rocks, tall grass, or a sand trap. The proposed change of scenery will be welcome.
