

# COMMERCIAL CLUB MEETS

ELECTS BOARD OF DIRECTORS  
FOR THE PRESENT YEAR.

Reports of Officers for Past Year Read  
Showing This Body to be in a  
Healthy and Prosperous Con-  
dition—Interest Taken.

The foregoing names is the personnel  
of the board of directors elected  
at the annual meeting of the Ard-  
more Commercial club held at the  
city hall last evening.

Despite the inclement weather there  
was a fair attendance. A feature of  
the meeting was the intense interest  
manifested in the selection of the  
board. It was agreed that live and  
active workers were needed on the  
board of directors and the men selected  
last night are among the most influen-  
tial in the city, men who are  
thoroughly alive to the needs of Ard-  
more and who intend to work unceas-  
ingly in behalf of the town.

The several reports of the secretary  
and treasurer were read. The report  
of Treasurer Bright showed that the  
revenue of the organization since  
last March amounted to \$1473, and  
that \$1012 had been disbursed, leav-  
ing in the treasury \$461, with Decem-  
ber dues to come in. The club is free  
from indebtedness and is in a flour-  
ishing condition.

The report of the secretary dealt  
with the affairs of the club, what it  
had accomplished during the past  
year and its work in general.

The finance committee also reported.  
The reports were received,  
adopted and ordered filed.

The election of the officers was then  
held. The by-laws provided the method  
of election and President Cruz  
appointed the nominating committee,  
consisting of Sidney Sager, W. P.  
Poland and A. W. Dunham. It was  
moved and seconded that the nominating  
committee constitute members of  
the board. Carried.

After the committee reported the  
newly elected directors met in the  
Mayor's office and selected the follow-  
ing officers for the ensuing year.

Lee Cruz, president; W. F. Whittin-  
gton, First vice president; Sam No-  
min, Second vice president and Perry  
D. Marwell, treasurer.
