## Work on Course At Rochelle Is Well Under Way

Eight of Nine Greens Laid Out; Stock Available

Rochelle, April 18—Eight of the nine greens on Rochelle's new golf course have been roughed in and rapid progress is being made in the completing of the fairways and seed-

ing of the greens.

Paul Henry and G. Kasky have been in charge of a force of workmen and the former states that barring unforseen trouble the final seeding of the greens and all fairways will have been accomplished within the next three weeks. The work is being done under the supervision of architect Perry Maxwell.

Public To Inspect

An invitation is extended on the part of the Rochelle Town and Country club to the public to inspect the clubhouse, formerly the P. G. Southworth residence, on South Main street all day Sunday. E. J. Berscheid, secretary-treasurer, states that the house will be open all day and the public is free to go through the building at any time.

Stock subscriptions for the course have been well taken care of although 60 shares of ownership stock are still available. The par value of the stock is now \$100, and it is class A stock. Class A stock carries ownership to the property and entitles the holder to clubhouse privileges but not to playing privileges.

To stimulate the sale, W. C. Whitcomb, president of the club, has made a standing offer to purchase one share for every ten sold.

To Open August 1

Class B stock will entitle the holder to a membership in the club with both playing and clubhouse privileges, subject to annual dues and by-laws of the club. Only one share of this stock is sold to a person.

It is believed that the course will be ready and open for playing by August 1. The architect is exceptionally well pleased with the location, richness of the soil and native

beauty of the site.
