

ADDITION IS BEING MADE TO COURSE AT HICKORY HILLS CLUB

Preliminary work has just been started at Hickory Hills, east of the city, on the additional nine-hole golf course, to be added to the present nine-hole course. Work on the original nine hole course has been carried on all winter and this part of the grounds is now being played on.

The fairways of the additional nine holes have been graded and rolled and the greens have been plowed and harrowed, preliminary to being seeded. With this preliminary work completed, a large force of men is to be put to work at once on the course and they will continue working until the second nine is ready for playing. It is expected that the second nine will be completed for players' use by the first of June, according to John T. Woodruff, owner of Hickory Hills. The first nine is now being played on and is considered to be in excellent shape.

With the additional nine holes, the Hickory Hills tract will be one of the best golf courses in this section of the country, laying as it does over rolling grounds, interspersed with excellent natural hazards. Golf experts who have played on the first nine have stated it to be one of the best they have ever played on.

The new course will lay south and east of the club house, which is situated in the center of the large estate.
