

Captain Maxwell Saves Many

Capt. Press Maxwell, who wears the wings of the Yugoslav air force headquarters rescue unit, credited with saving some 5000 American fliers downed in the Balkans, is now at the Enid army air field. He was sent there from Camp Davis, S. C., following a leave spent with relatives at Ardmore. At Enid the officer will take a refresher course and work with B-25s.

After he completed combing missions as a Liberator pilot over enemy targets in Europe last December, he did rescue work with B-25s in Yugoslavia. He is the son of Perry Maxwell, 612 McLish avenue, who has earned national recognition as a designer of golf courses.
