Grass Planting at Prairie Dunes Completed

The last grass planting was done on the fairways and all construction work, except the building of the club house, was completed yesterday at the new Prairie Dunes golf course being built north of Hutchinson in the sand hills.

The rains of the past two weeks have been particularly favorable to the newly planted seed, with the first sprouts of the bermuda grass beginning to color the fairways and the green already boasting a rich, velvet carpet of bent grass that is almost ready for play.

Start Soon on Club House.

Only the club house remains to be built, and plans are being drawn now. Construction is expected to begin within the next few days.

The site of the building which is to face south is in approximately the center of the nine-hole course. Grouped about it are the fourth, sixth and ninth greens.

North of the club house site a few hundred yards is the caretakers lodge, the workshop and garage. These buildings belong to the California ranch house type of architecture as will the new club house.

Large Reservoir.

To the east of the caretakers lodge a 2,000,000 gallon reservoir to take care of the water needs of the club, has been constructed. The reservoir is fed by five pumps located northeast of the lodge.

Sprinklers are kept going constantly on the fairways and greens.

The course was designed by Perry D. Maxwell, well-known golf architect, and the construc-
