

# WATERED COURSE IS ASSURED FOR TWIN HILLS CLUB Well Will Be Sunk Monday; Board of Directors Elected.

Watered fairways!

They're a certainty for the Twin Hills Golf and Country club.

Work on the installation of the six-inch mains and the digging of a twelve-inch well will be started Monday. Were not today the Sabbath the job would begin this morning, so anxious are the sponsors of the idea to inaugurate it.

Watering of the fairways, and the entire course for that matter, means that the Twin Hills will boast one of the few properly moistened courses in the southwest. The nearest to here is at Dallas, Texas.

Work has already started on the sodding of the tees and greens and probably will be completed this week.

Decision to install the watering system means that the plan to officially open the course about July 4 is quite certain to be realized, as keeping the entire course properly moistened will infinitely aid the growth of the grass.

The decision to water the course was made at a meeting of the club stockholders Saturday, with the idea in mind of completing the course as soon as physically possible.

"If we don't reach water at 500 feet we'll go down and down until we do," Peery Maxwell, golf architect in charge of the construction of the course, said Saturday night in reference to the sinking of the well.

A board of directors and an advisory board were elected at Saturday's meeting. Monday night officers of the board will be elected.
