

There will be an exhibition match between two professionals on the opening day. Neil Crose, who for the past several years has been golf professional at the Springfield Country club, will take part in the exhibition match on Decoration day. His opponent has not been selected. Mr. Woodruff announced that Professional Crose would serve as professional for both the Country club and the Hickory Hills course. Par and bogey for the course will be established by the professionals.

There will be a barbecue, which which will be presided over by George McDaniel. This will be open to all members of the club. Arrangements have been made to have a total of 300 members in the new club and over half of this number have been secured. The course will be operated in connection with the new Kentwood hotel, which is now under the course of construction on St. Louis street near the Shrine mosque.

A large outbuilding on the Woodruff farm will be transformed into a club house. Lockers and showers will be located in the basement. There will be a large club room 27 by 46 feet, the floor of which will be constructed of hardwood. This will make it an inviting place for dancing.

Trophy to Be Offered.

On the opening day there will be a foursome match and the winner will receive a trophy which has been offered by W. W. Woods.

The second course at Hickory Hills has been laid out and construction will be started immediately after work on the present nine-hole course has been completed. Several veteran golfers of the city have visited Hickory Hills during the past several days and all have been profuse in their admiration of its scenic beauty and its natural hazards.

The first tee is located a short distance west of the club house and it is 425 yards from the green. There is a natural hazard at 280 yards in the form of a depression which was formed by the contour of the ground. The airway leading to green No. 1 is 75 yards wide.

From the second tee to the green it is a total of 280 yards. In negotiating this hole the driver has the advantage of a long roll. The entire course has a good stand of blue grass and white clover and all of the greens are sloping. The hazard that the golfer in negotiating is the obstacle for hole No. 2
