

Work Progressing On New Golf Club Being Built Here

Estimated to cost more than \$500,000, the thirty-six-hole golf course now being developed on a 250-acre tract at Lemmon avenue and Northwest Highway is rapidly being cleared to be put into shape for play next-summer.

Improvements on the land are being removed and preparations made to sod the tract. The land for the course is expected to be ready by the middle of next week for the golf architect, Perry Maxwell of Ardmore, Ok., to start the work of laying out the course in detail, it was learned Thursday from Charles E. Turner of the Charles E. Turner Company, which is developing the \$500,000 project.

Engineers for the work are Myers, Noyes & Forrest, while W. B. Woodruff will landscape the course, part of a tract of 377 acres owned by the company. While a commercial course, privileges will be sold only for the year with clubhouse and shower room facilities to be included. A large clubhouse with 600 lockers and other necessary equipment for this many golfers will be built, with the course and the clubhouse due to be ready and in condition for play by May, Mr. Turner said. The clubhouse will include a coffee shop but no dance floor or clubrooms.

With its natural roll and with a draw which is to be converted into an artificial lake, the tract is expected to be developed into one of the finest courses in the entire South.
