

New Tees and Greens And More Hazards to Supply Added Thrills

Old Johnny Golfer has been sailing around the local courses in the middle eighties and has occasionally slipped down into the high seventies during the 1938 season, but he will face improved and far more difficult tests during the coming year.

The Dallas professionals, working with their grounds and greens committees, will make course improvements and strengthen par as follows:

The first and eighteenth greens at the Lakewood Country Club will be leveled to eliminate the elevation on the back side.

A water well will be dug at the Glen Lakes Country Club so that the fairways can be watered nightly. The well will be completed by Jan. 15.

The seventh, sixteenth and eighteenth greens will be rearranged and made smaller during February or March at the Brook Hollow Club in keeping with the modernization program at that course.
