

CAR OF POTATOES ARRIVES IN CITY

Idaho Farmers Contribute
Spuds for Benefit of Drought
Sufferers Here.

Shipment of a car of Irish potatoes sent by Idaho farmers to drought sufferers of Carter county has been received here and will be distributed through the local chapter of the American Red Cross. The chapter also has received a quantity of powdered yeast to be used in its fight against pellagra.

Much pellagra is found among people living in rural districts of the county, according to Mrs. C. G. Squires, Red Cross secretary. There also is some tuberculosis and cancer and a great number of physically-handicapped persons, investigators find.

Headed by Perry Maxwell, orders for food amounting to \$481 were being distributed today in the northwest part of the county, between 84 families living at Milo, Clemscot, Graham, County Line and other towns in that district.
