

# Work Starts On Added Nine Holes At Odessa Country Club Course

Odessa Country Club had today completed a membership drive, and the financing of an additional nine holes to the local golf course, making it an 18-hole championship course. The new layout will be 6,800 feet with a 36-36 par 72 for the 18 holes.

In order that the new course come up to national championship measurements, the local greens and finance committee headed by Tom Pickering obtained the services of Dean Woods and Perry Maxwell of Oklahoma to layout the course and to build it. Work was started on No. 10 green today, with Woods overseeing construction.

The ever-increasing membership of this West Texas club has required the adding of the nine holes. It is said that national defense projects in the Midland-Odessa area had brought many new government employees into this section, and the local committees are doing their bit in applying the USO spirit without

government financing.

The Odessa club had just recently added an addition to the lockers for both men and women, and has also completed a first class lounge and a men's smoker den.

Dean Woods and Perry Maxwell constitute a team which draws the plans and builds golf courses all over the United States. Their most recent notable course being the re-building of Fort Worth's Colonial Club course for the National Open golf matches which drew so much attention to Southwest sporting circles. Woods and Maxwell are also credited with the building of the Philadelphia course over which another national tournament was held, as well as three new courses just completed on Long Island, New York. Another Maxwell layout is the famous Dornick Hills course at Ardmore, Oklahoma, this course was adjudged one of the three most beautiful courses in U. S. for several years.
