

Famous Golf Architect Compliments Twin Hills

Mackenzie Says Courses Should Be Built For All Classes Of Players.

That golf courses can be built of such a type which will appeal to every class of player, was the statement made Monday by Dr. A. Mackenzie, golf architect of London, here as a guest of Perry Maxwell.

Mackenzie, who is known the world over as one of the greatest designers of golf courses, frowned on the idea of cities building two types of courses, one for the average golfer and one for the best masher welders.

He pointed out that a course could be constructed so as to be difficult for the best golfers and at the same time be easy for Mr. Average Business Man. "That is the trouble with the American links today. They are

not of high enough standard for the best players and they are too difficult for the average fellow," he said.

Mackenzie was favorably impressed with the Twin Hills course here. "It is one of the most beautiful pieces of golf architecture I have seen in America. It is delightfully natural looking while it is artistic," he said in speaking of Twin Hills.

He said that the Twin Hills course would rank with those on Long Island which were built by Charles MacDonalld at a cost of approximately \$1,000,000.

This is MacDonalld's first trip to America.
