

# Tulsa Golf Course Increases in Area

**TULSA**—Tulsa Country club is Oklahoma's "golfingest" private layout. Now it has acquired elbow room and lofty ambitions to match its illustrious past.

Founded in 1904 the club is third or fourth oldest golf course ever built in the state. History is dim on the subject but it is believed that a long-since plowed under course in Oklahoma City, the present Muskogee Country club and possibly the first Guthrie course were built before Tulsa Country club opened its door to members three years prior to statehood.

It is 10 years older than Dornick Hills in Ardmore and bows only to Muskogee in the matter of seniority from the standpoint of continuous operation.

The TCC course as it is now layed out is located on a 123-acre tract that until a few months ago was a part of the estate of the late Samuel G. Kennedy, a Tulsa pioneer with a lot of civic pride and the money with which to back it up.

Tulsa Country club operated through all the years on this tract of land under a long-time lease that insured its continuance. Recently the club members negotiated with the estate and purchased the land. The club already had acquired 7½ acres along the western boundary and at the time of the purchase from the Kennedy estate another 27 acres was bought along the western property line.

The land on the west side of the course that has been purchased was at one time a portion of the vast Kennedy holdings and a public fee course once operated adjacent to TCC as Kennedy Golf course.
