COUNTRY CLUB AT HENRYETTA IS ORGANIZED

Purchase of Valuable Track
Of Land Made and Work
On Club House Starts.

HENRYETTA, Feb. 22.—(Special.)

The Henryetta country club, recently incorporated with a capital stock of \$50,000, has effected permanent organization and elected officers and a board of directors. W. P. Rorex was made president; George W. Burnett and H. H. Spencer, first and second vice-presidents; H. J. Butterly, treasurer and E. F. Woodson, secretary, with Roy Corbit, J. R. Vaughn, J. F. Burbank, M. A. Berman, R. B. F. Hummer and W. F. Chist. as directors.

The club has secured 160 acres located on a hill three miles out and overlooking the city, purchasing "top and bottom" which in this country means that they own besides the surface, all mineral rights of whatever nature that may lie underneath the face of the tract. It is stated that the club is fortunate in its selection of a site as the tract is known to possess large coal deposits, which could be mined without interfering with social affairs of the organization. More than half of the stock has already been paid in, and work of erecting a club house, laying out golf links and tennis courts, and ball grounds will begin at once. A gradual slope lying between two hills will also be walled and made into a lake for boating purposes.
