

Too Many Women Play

Long Waits Irk Local Golfers At Wichita

Several Hutchinson women golfers returned from an invitational tournament at Wichita this week saying "Never again".

Play was scheduled early in the morning, so a group of Hutchinson players arrived before 8 o'clock. They found the first tee already congested, and were obliged to wait until nearly 11 o'clock before starting play.

Even after starting a round, progress was slow. One Hutchinson woman reported she started play at 9 o'clock, and didn't reach the 18th green until nearly 4 o'clock. Foursomes were stacked three and four deep, waiting at every tee.

The congestion apparently was due to too many invitations and acceptances. A total of 226 play-

ers took part—despite the fact the Wichita Country Club course was undergoing repairs and was not in top condition. The best score in the field was 91.
