PLANS ARE TO BE GIVEN TO GILES

Civic Clubs and Citizens to Be Asked to Assist in Equipping Field.

Workmen from the transient relief buteau, under the direction of Perry Maxwell, supervisor in charge, have made a decided showing in cutting out the heavy timber and undergrowth on the 10-acre site of Walker Athletic field on the west boundary of the city.

The work is moving ahead progressively and when it is completed the ground will be ready for the laborers to begin excavation and grading on the tract.

Plans and specifications for this new athletic center are to be presented to Col. Carl Giles, state C. W. A. chief and it is hoped that funds will be made immediately available to start actual construction of the field.

If present plans carry out a huge arena, large enough to stage football games and provide seating places for thousands will be build on the tract of land that is a "natural" for the purpose.

More Funds Needed

It is pointed out by those in charge that the field will have to have additional funds than those that are to be available from the C. W. A. A quantity of material will be needed and CWA funds do not provide this phase of the work. Therefore, it seems certain that the citizens, the city administration and the civic clubs will be offered a chance to have a part in the donation of funds necessary to complete the project.

One club has already signified its intention to supply the fence for the field—an item of more than passing importance. Other clubs will doubtless be given an opportunity to provide some part of the equipment.
